GRANDVIEW SIGN—One of the large Grandview Lake entrance signs (brown with yellow paint) at the Poplar Drive entrance is missing. If anyone sees it please return it to the office.

LEAF DISPOSAL—A pilot leaf disposal program will be offered this year for Grandview homeowners who would like to participate. Leaves will be vacuumed every Monday in November and as needed in December for those who wish to participate. Please call the GLOA office 812-342-1219 to register. You will then be contacted, and based on the amount of leaves and the location of your pile, you will be given an estimate of the cost to participate. Most likely (\$25-\$50). We ask that you cover the leaf pile with a tarp when you are done so we don't have the leaves blowing back into neighbor's yards.

Snow Birds & Seasonal Grandviewites

Call Southwestern Bartholomew Water Corporation at 812-342-4421 to turn off water at the road source while you are away for an extended time. Last winter the Kromes turned off the water at their house but not at the road. The line from the road to the house froze and burst resulting in an almost \$400 water bill and an additional pipe repair bill. The water company will send out a technician to turn your water on and off at your requested dates!
