Having a Package Delivered?

Package delivery services like FedEx, and Amazon don't always deliver these items to your door. It's not unusual to see these packages left by mailboxes along the road.

If you are having a package delivered, sign up for the tracking service that notifies you when it is delivered. If you are not at your Grandview Lake home, perhaps a kind neighbor will put it on your porch or some other discreet location so that it doesn't disappear.

LAKE SAFETY—Jason Carroll

Hello fellow lot owners. Summer is almost here and that means we all need to remember to be SAFE. That's right, EVERYONE needs to practice safe boating, safe swimming, and safe everything.

- 1. **Life Jackets:** Did you know you are required to have enough life jackets for everyone in the boat? It's true. If your boat is filled with people, you may be stopped to ensure enough life jackets are available.
 - **a.** Do you know if your child's life jacket really works? Will your life jacket for a small child allow the child to float face up? Has the child grown since they last used the life jacket? All of these questions are very important prior to placing your small child in the water.

- 2. Speed Limit: The speed limit on the lake is 35MPH during the day, every day. Idle at night.
- 3. Idle zone areas: Idle zone areas are areas where boats must not make a wake; these areas are designated by buoys which either say idle zone, or no wake and are in the smaller areas of coves.
 NOTICE: Some buoys marking 100ft from shore might say no wake. If these buoys are not located in a designated idle zone, assume it's marking 100ft from shore.
- 4. Boat Ballast: Are not allowed in boats. Severe sanctions will occur if caught utilizing ballast.
- 5. **MAJOR Update**: If your boat has integrated seating which is molded into the rear of the boat you will be allowed to sit in this area while the boat is in motion provided the person **seated** is properly wearing a LIFE JACKET- no exceptions. Remember, all legs, feet etc., must be within the boat while in motion. Riding in the front of a pontoon boat or other type of boat with feet dangling in the water is not permitted and is extremely dangerous.
- 6. **Anchoring in idle zone areas**: Please respect your fellow neighbors when anchoring in idle zone areas. Loud music, cursing, etc, is not neighborly. Let your guest know this as well. Everyone wants to enjoy the lake.
- 7. **Slalom course**: The slalom course is for slalom skiers, not tubers or jet skis.
- 8. **Boat Reminder:** Anyone purchasing a new or used boat **MUST** coordinate with the GLOA office prior to placing a boat on the lake. This includes **Test Driving** boats. This is strictly enforced.
- 9. **Wake Surfing Area**: The area below in dark green is the designated area for wake surfing on the lake. All wake surfing must be done no less than 300ft from shore. **NO wake surfing in the yellow areas** (coves and within 300 feet of shore).

May 21: First Sailing Race of the Season Approaches (and Annual Sock Burning/Poetry Reading)

It's time to uncover the sailboat, evict the spiders and get it ship-shape for our Sunday, May 21st 2pm race. At the "protest meeting" following the race we will celebrate the coming barefoot season by burning our stinky winter socks and reading event-appropriate poetry as they are tossed into the flames.

You'll need to familiarize yourself with it ahead of time, rig it, etc. Requires 1 crew.

We also need "Committee Boat" volunteers. The Committee Boat is the pontoon boat used for starting and timing the races. Those on board share the tasks involved and enjoy the very best place to observe the dramas that occur during a typical race. The Committee Boat is the best place on the lake on Sunday afternoons.

<u>Information needed:</u> Your name, billing address, lot number, phone number and LENGTH of shoreline.

Treatment will extend out 100 feet from the shore. Cost is \$4.00 per linear foot of shoreline. Aquatic Control will handle billing. Treatment is scheduled for Wednesday, June 21st.

1-day swimming restriction in treated areas only, no irrigation restriction. Other water use restrictions include:

- Livestock/domestic animal watering- 1 day
- Turf irrigation 3 days
- Food crop irrigation 5 days
- Drinking water- 3 days

Deadline for signup is Monday June 12th.
