#### Welcome to summer!

### Please see the following tips below for fun filled safety information.

- 1. **Idle Zones:** Please stop your wake making speed **PRIOR** to entering an idle/no wake zone.
- 2. Carbon Monoxide (CO) can affect passengers in boats, whether they are at speed, anchored or idling. CO levels from boat exhaust can reach critical levels in a short time.
  - You cannot see, smell, or taste CO
  - Never sit, teak surf, or hang on the back deck or swim platform while the engines are running.
  - Symptoms of CO poisoning include:
    - o Severe headache, dizziness, confusion, nausea, fainting.
    - If you suspect CO poisoning, immediately get the victim to fresh air and seek medical care.
- 3. **Electrocution in water** also known as an electric shock drowning is when faulty wiring in a pool light or on a boat dock or boat launch releases an electrical current into the water, thus electrifying the water, and a person such as a swimmer, comes into contact with the electrified water. Tragically, the person becomes a conductor of the electricity as it passes through his or her body. This paralyzes the person's muscles, rendering him or her unable to swim, which could ultimately cause the person to drown. **Please check all electrical wires in and around docks, boatlifts, etc.**
- 4. Only TWO people on a tube/behind the boat during the holiday weekend (and weekends in general). Please, review the rules for further information and details.
- 5. All skiers and jet skiers must wear a **life jacket** when being towed or operating a jet ski—no exceptions.
- 6. Drinking and boating: Indiana law prohibits anyone from boating while intoxicated—that is, operating a motorboat or a PWC while intoxicated due to alcohol or drugs. Alcohol and drugs cause impaired balance, blurred vision, poor coordination, impaired judgment, and slower reaction times. Alcohol is a major contributor to boating accidents and fatalities. Lot owners please remember you are responsible for your guests. Please help spread the word about the lake safety rules.
- 7. As a reminder, Ballast of any kind is **prohibited.**
- 8. Please do not swim across the main part of the lake during the weekend; boats might hit you.
- 9. **Common sense**: Sound and prudent judgment based on a simple perception of the situation or facts. Please use common sense this weekend.

## WEED CONTROL SIGN UP

Email or call the GLOA office at 812-342-1219 to sign up. **Deadline** for signup is Monday June 12th.

<u>Information needed:</u> Your name, billing address, lot number, phone number and LENGTH of shoreline.

Treatment will extend out 100 feet from the shore. Cost is \$4.00 per linear foot of shoreline. Aquatic Control will handle billing. Treatment is scheduled for Wednesday, June 21st.

1-day swimming restriction in treated areas only, no irrigation restriction. Other water use restrictions include:

- Livestock/domestic animal watering- 1 day
- Turf irrigation 3 days
- Food crop irrigation 5 days
- Drinking water- 3 days


